



Audrey Holland Award

Presented every other year at the Aphasia Access Leadership Summit

The Audrey Holland Award of Aphasia Access recognizes an Aphasia Access member, in good standing, for their distinguished contribution to the Life Participation Approach to Aphasia (LPAA).

Audrey Holland, throughout her illustrious career – as a professor, mentor, researcher, clinician – saw the impact the LPAA had on the overall health and long-term rehabilitation of people with aphasia and their families. As a founding member of Aphasia Access in 2014, Audrey understood the importance of establishing an organization of committed LPAA professionals to share resources, provide training and education to those in the healthcare field, and advocate for this method of treatment to other speech-language pathologists and allied healthcare professionals.

The award may be presented to an individual whose contributions have been made in a single area or multiple areas of achievement within the LPAA. This individual can be a speech-language pathologist or other professional that works within the field. This award recognizes an LPAA professional that has demonstrated an outstanding accomplishment in areas including:

- Clinical Service
- Counseling and supportive programming
- Education and training
- Research
- Advocacy
- Leadership and mentoring

Nominations for the Holland Award are due no later than February 15th. Those award will be announced during Aphasia Access 2019 Leadership Summit (March 7-9 in Baltimore, MD) during a plenary session.

Individuals are encouraged to nominate those that they believe embody the spirit of the award. Self-nominations are welcome as well.



To Nominate:

Please submit information and/or documentation that supports how the candidate embodies the spirit of the Holland Award, as described above.

Elements that must be included with all submissions:

- Letter of nomination (or self-nomination), not to exceed 2 single-spaced pages
- Nominees contact information including CV or link to online CV (if available)
- Additional materials that support the nominee's contributions
