# **Aphasia Access Conversations: A Conversation with David Greenberg**

In this episode of the *Aphasia Access Conversations* podcast we have a conversation with David Greenberg, the president and CEO of the League for People with Disabilities in Baltimore, Maryland. Mr. Greenberg has an MBA, a BSc, and extensive experience in healthcare and working with people with disabilities.

To begin the episode, Mr. Greenberg provides insight into the work of the League, its partnership with SCALE, and the work done at Aphasia Access. These organizations help people living with disabilities improve their quality of life. There are various programs and classes that individuals can choose to take part in. Ranging from photography, Biblical studies, and singing and music, and plenty more. All the programs and classes provide the means to make improvements and overall life satisfaction for people.

Mr. Greenberg provides some advice on partnering with organizations similar to the League. In his opinion, you should be looking to broaden and diversify your connections outside the disability (LPAA) circle, to the wider society. The League currently has a partnership with UM School of Social Work, providing a full-time social work program and a clinical dimension to the organization. The League also had a positive influence on Aphasia Access' membership, further spreading the word in this domain.
